Thanks to the annual support from McCleaners, Radio NL, Lighthouse Christian Fellowship, St. Andrews Church and our donors, we are able to connect those in need with fresh, clean winter jackets. This year's drop-off dates for coat donations are during McCleaners business hours from October 3rd-16th at any of the three McCleaners location in Kamloops. The coats will then be cleaned and distributed around the community to those who need it most.

In addition to coat donations, please consider donating the following items to our church or Thrift Store: warm clothing, socks, blankets, and personal hygiene items. We plan to distribute them to a number of people who come through our doors or visit our mobile kitchen this winter.

Human Trafficking Awareness

On Sunday, September 25th, Captain Lisa Trickett lead a service focusing on human trafficking and the value of human life. What many people don't realize, is that this modern-day form of slavery still exists, and is the 2nd largest criminal activity worldwide. Despite its illegality, there are still thousands of people each year, in Canada, who are being bought and sold for the purposes of sexual exploitation, forced labour, organ harvesting, and forced marriage. The Kamloops Community Church took collection and raised a total of \$1000 (we aim to raise a total of \$5000 by the end of the year) for Deborah's Gate: a specialized home in Vancouver for trafficked women, men, and children fleeing their abusers. This is the only program of its kind run by The Salvation Army in North America.



The Salvation Army Kamloops Thrift Store dedicated one week on the subject and wrote notes on their sidewalk every day to spread the word to the public. Various social services and organizations will participate in order to connect homeless persons with resources to help end their cycle of poverty. Many people that find themselves homeless have a difficult time breaking themselves free of their situation and need many supports. In past years, services such as haircuts, flu shots, and a hot meal were provided to everyone that attended. The Salvation Army will be attending again this year to hand out winter gear (coats, gloves, hats, socks, etc.) and to promote our programs and services for those that may not already know what supports are available.
